Legislative Talking Points

Lifting the Coal Moratorium

By lifting the moratorium:

- The legislation is about providing affordable and reliable base load energy in the future and helping this country achieve energy independence.
- It does not change our approach to renewable energy. It simply makes sure we'll have electricity when the sun doesn't shine and the wind doesn't blow.
- It allows the importation of new cleaner and more efficient coal-generated electricity and replacement of older, less efficient plants.

By NOT lifting the moratorium:

- It will be hard for Minnesota's cooperatives to invest in emerging clean coal technologies.
- Will have a direct impact on the member of Great River Energy-ultimately KPC customers. Credit #15943001
- The current language for exemptions and offsets create too much uncertainty and doesn't reflect market realities. It would send MN ratepayer money to utilities and investors on the coasts.

Lifting the Nuclear Moratorium

We need all sources of electricity to meet future energy demand in the most cost-effective way.

Although there are no immediate plans to invest in nuclear energy, there may be a time in the future when a nuclear plant makes great sense for our members.

Reforming the Conversation Improvement Program (CIP)

- Meeting the 1.5% savings goal in CIP is a bigger challenge for the cooperative's who's load profile is typically made up of a high percentage of residential customer compared to the investor owned utilities and most municipals who's have a higher percentage of Commercial and Industrial accounts in their load profile. These differences present unique challenges in meeting CIP goals. This program should not be a "One Size Fits All" approach. A good example is: KPC's load profile is 85% residential.
- The lack of customer density per mile of line makes it significantly more expensive and labor intensive to meet the CIP goals for Cooperatives such as KPC.

Sound Stray Voltage Policy - Based on Science

- Any legislation that addresses stray voltage issues should be based on the established science reflected in the PUC's Science Advisors' final report.
- For decades Electric Cooperatives have worked with the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission (PUC) and the Midwest Rural Energy Council academics and researchers to address stray voltage issues through training, research, investigations, consumer education, and inter-utility task force.
