UPCOMING COOPERATIVE BYLAW VOTE

In 2024, the Kandiyohi Power Cooperative Board of Directors is asking our members to approve proposed amendments to the Cooperative's Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws.

As a not-for-profit electric cooperative, Kandiyohi Power Cooperative is governed by a series of documents, including Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws, that were first established when the Cooperative was organized in 1935. These important documents provide a framework for governing and conducting business.

As time passes, the energy industry changes, technology advances and member needs and expectations grow. It is important to periodically review and amend the Articles of Incorporation and the Bylaws in order to remain relevant and effective. It's been over 10 years since this process last occurred.

Over the last six months Kandiyohi Power Cooperative staff, the Board of Directors, our attorney, and an independent communication consultant conducted a review of the Cooperative's Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws. After reviewing these documents line by line and comparing them to Cooperative business procedures, future needs, and industry advancements, we've identified a variety of necessary alterations. In recent months the Cooperative has been hard at work rewriting these important business guidelines to incorporate the changes needed as our business moves forward.

While the proposed amendments have been approved by the current Board of Directors, they cannot be placed into effect without approval by a majority vote of the members that participate in the voting process. This membership vote will take place in conjunction with the Director elections and Annual Meeting on April 23, 2024.

As that date gets closer, we'll keep you informed. Tune into future issues of the newsletter, watch for details on our website and Facebook page and look for your ballot package in the mail, all of these will include additional information.

Appliances - Energy Star Certified Only

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Electric Water Heating - Available to New Load Management Only

• ETS – 80-100 Gallon\$400^{.00} Control Strategy

- Water heaters are recharged for 8 hours on weekdays typically between 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. during the winter months and 10:00 p.m. to 9:00 a.m. during the summer months
- ETS water heaters are not controlled on weekends and holidays unless peak control is needed
- \$12.00 monthly credit with usage of 301 kWh or greater on primary meter
- Interruptible Water Heating 50-100 Gallon\$100.00 Control Strategy:
 - Interrupted for up to 8 hours on days peak control is needed
 - \$8.00 monthly credit with usage of 301 kWh or greater on primary meter

Installed Water Heaters must have .90 Energy Factor or higher.

Electric Vehicle – Must be on Off-Peak EV Charging Rate

• Installation of qualifying hardwired, level 2 electric vehicle supply equipment (EVSE)\$200.00

Fluorescent Bulb Recycling

- Option #1 Recycle CFL/fluorescent bulbs at KPC. Must be a member.
- Option #2 Bring bulbs directly to the Recycling Center, 1400 22nd St SW Willmar. Bring KPC electric bill as proof of membership and they will not be charged.
- LED lights can be disposed of in garbage, no need to recycle.

NFW PAYMENT IVR

What is an IVR? An Interactive Voice Response (IVR) is an automated phone system technology that collects information via a prerecorded menu to direct the call to the appropriate place. We recently switched our payment IVR to serve you better. The new IVR has increased menu options including check account status, make a payment, add or edit a stored payment method, manage recurring payments, manage personal ID number (PIN) and update your phone number. The first time using the IVR, you will be asked to set up a 4-digit PIN number to use in all future interaction with the IVR, make sure you save this number! The IVR will ask questions regarding account information to verify your identity and prevent unauthorized account access for your protection, such as the account number, the last 4 digits of the primary account holder's social security number, the amount of the last payment, etc. If you have questions about the IVR, or need assistance please contact us at 800-551-4951 or contactus@kpcoop.com.




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DIRECTOR FILINGS NOW OPEN FOR DISTRICTS 1, 2 AND 3
